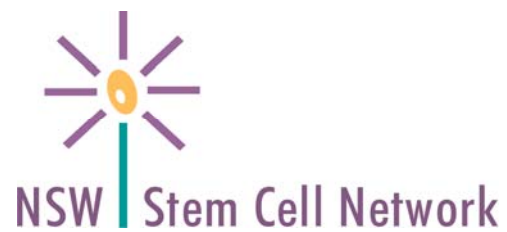

Whether they are embryonic or adult stem cells, many patients have high expectations that stem cell therapies are just around the corner – be it for arthritis, diabetes, spinal cord injuries or macular degeneration.

The promise of a silver bullet treatment is attractive for patients who suffer from serious conditions, but exactly how realistic are their hopes? With medical tourism on the rise, this is a perfect opportunity to reacquaint yourself with the field of stem cells and support your patients by knowing the facts.

The evening will be presented by Dr Bernie Tuch, the Director of the NSW Stem Cell Network. His former Diabetes Transplant Unit was responsible for the creation of the Endeavour human embryonic stem cell lines.
